Reminder of Road Closure – Minetown Day

Council of the District of Lantzville has approved the closure of the portion of Lantzville Road between Ware Road and Lantzville School Road from 9:45 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. (1 hour) on Saturday, September 12th, 2009, to facilitate the Minetown Day Parade. Traffic control individuals will be present to redirect traffic through Lantzville via alternate routes.

Olympic Torch Relay

Dickinson Road Watermain Replacement

Initially scheduled for construction in 2007, this project was put on hold due to the high costs of construction at the time. In July the District re-tendered this project and quotes came in considerably lower than 2007, allowing the project to proceed in 2009. Construction will begin in September with Knappett Industries being named the successful bidder. The scope of the work consists of placing approximately 290m of 200mm diameter PVC watermain piping between Warick and Myron Roads. This will replace the existing 100mm asbestos cement pipe. In addition, approximately 60m of 100mm PVC diameter watermain is to be placed on Myron Road replacing the 50mm plastic line that is currently in place.

Burning

This is a friendly reminder that as of June 5th, a complete burning ban has been in effect in Lantzville. Open burning is only permitted between October 15th and May 15th of each year on Fridays and Saturdays. A "Class B Incinerator Permit" is required and can be obtained from the District Office or on the District's website.

Property Tax Prepayment Program

Did you know that the District of Lantzville allows pre-payment of your property taxes? Early payment interest is applied to all pre-payments. There are two ways you can prepay:

1. Online banking: you can set up the District of Lantzville as one of your online payment options. Please contact the District Office if you require assistance.
2. Post-dated cheques: you can provide the District with 12 post-dated cheques for monthly payments.

Please contact the District Office if you'd like to begin pre-payment of your taxes.

Low Flush Toilet Rebate Program

The Low Flush Toilet Rebate Program continues in Lantzville. As part of its Financial Plan discussions, Council agreed to continue to extend this program for another year. There are specific requirements associated with this program, so be sure to pick up an application form at the District Office or online at www.lantzville.ca.

Many homes are equipped with older toilets that require 13 or more litres per flush. New low flush toilets require only 6 litres per flush and dual flush toilets use between 3 to 6 litres. By replacing your old toilet, you could use up to 1/3 less water. That could save more than 200 litres per day or 70,000 litres per year. (WOW!). For a limited time, the District of Lantzville is offering a lifetime maximum of two (2) rebates per residence for those connected to the Lantzville water system. Replacing toilets using 13 litres or more, with a CSA approved new low flush model will earn you a rebate. District of Lantzville staff will review your application and, if you qualify, mail you a cheque for \$60 (low flush toilet) or \$100 (dual flush toilet). REMINDER...only two (2) toilets per residence are eligible for the rebate. Rebate for new construction is \$40. Please be advised that submission of an application does not guarantee a rebate and REMEMBER...check out the application requirements before doing any work as photos of your old toilet are required, including a photo showing the smashed tank.
