The newly-elected Councillors were sworn in on August 31st and the 7-member Council is now responsible to set budgets, levy taxes, adopt bylaws, establish policies and make decisions that guide the growth, development and operation of the District of Lantzville. District staff, led by new CAO Brad McRae are responsible for day to day operations, implementing Council decisions and policies, and providing advice to elected officials. Minetown Day volunteers have been busy planning a full day of family fun starting at 8:00 am with the Pancake Breakfast at the Legion and the Parade at 10:30 am, and continue at Huddlestone Park from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm. Events include Hay Rides, Pony Rides and Petting Zoo, Live Music and Entertainment, Street Market, Local Artisans, and Tons of Rides and Games! Parking is available near Seaview Elementary School; no parking is permitted on Huddlestone Road.

Lantzville Road, from the parade staging area at 7175 Lantzville Road (Dr. Bunting's Office) to Huddlestone Road, will be closed temporarily for 1 hour from 10:00 am to 11:00 am to facilitate the Minetown Day Parade. Traffic control will be present during the closure to redirect traffic through Lantzville via alternate routes. Expect traffic delays, please obey all directions given by traffic control, and use caution with the increased pedestrian traffic throughout the day.

While last year's 5K and 1K family fun runs were successful for first time runs, unfortunately, as a result of logistical challenges and scheduling conflict with other events, the Minetown Day 5K and 1K will not be held in 2015. The Province and the District have entered into an agreement for the District to maintain the trails on this crown land. The Parks and Recreation Commission is looking for volunteers to help trim brush, construct bridges and improve the recreation trails. This work is considered heavy construction work. Bylaw Reminders

Open Burning – The **FIRE BAN** declared in Lantzville June 10, 2015 due to the extreme dry forest conditions, continues. This means that no burning is permitted until the ban is lifted. This applies to any open fire including campfires and incinerator burning. Monitor the District's website for more information on the **FIRE BAN**. When weather permits, the campfire ban may be lifted but the open burning ban will remain in effect, as it does every year, until October 15th. STAGE 4 Watering Restrictions Effective July 11th

ALL Outdoor Watering is Strictly Prohibited *except* for watering by hand, using a hose with an automatic shut off, trees, shrubs, flowers, and vegetables between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00 am OR 7:00 pm and 9:00 pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays. **No washing of vehicles, boats, driveways, etc., and no filling of pools or hot tubs. NO AUTOMATIC LAWN SPRINKLING OR DRIP SYSTEMS ALLOWED. No New Lawn Sprinkling Permits will be Issued. NO EXCEPTIONS!** *Please note that watering restrictions only apply to those property owners who are on the District's community water system but we encourage those with private wells to also exercise water conservation measures. Adhering to these water restrictions will assist in stabilizing our supply of potable water for household use and fire protection!*

School Zones – In anticipation of the new school year for public and independent schools, please exercise extra caution when driving in or near school zones and playgrounds, and watch out for children. When a school is in session, a 30 km/h school zone speed limit is in effect from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm every school day.

Traffic Notes – Under Construction!

Motorists and pedestrians, please allow extra time, exercise caution, and observe directions given by traffic control personnel when in areas scheduled for roadwork and construction this Fall. The Phantom Road culvert replacement project at Copley Brook started August 24th and is scheduled to complete by September 15th. The next major project is paving on Lancrest Terrace and Lavender Road, tentatively planned to begin in late September. FOOD WASTE, GARBAGE & RECYCLING SCHEDULE

After the recycling and food waste collection on Thursday, September 3rd, collection resumes on Friday, September 11th with garbage and food waste pick-up, and continues on Fridays until Thanksgiving on October 12th, after which pick-up is on Mondays.
